What Not To Flush!

Sewers are designed to carry water, human waste and toilet paper only.

Diapers, wipes, feminine sanitary products, and other products sold as “flushable” can damage the sewer system, cause sewer backups in your home, lead to expensive maintenance problems, and result in sewage releases to the environment.

Please do **not flush the following items:**

The items listed below should be disposed of in the trash, not the toilet:

- Band-aids and bandage wrappers
- Cleaning wipes
- Condoms
- Cotton balls, swabs, and pads
- Dental floss
- Disposable diapers, wipes, and nursing pads
- Facial wipes and tissues
- Feminine sanitary products (tampons, pads and applicators)
- Flammable or explosive substances
- Hair
- Kitty litter
- Needles and syringes
- Paper towels
- Rags
- Razors and blades
- Unused over the counter and prescription medications

Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG)

In the kitchen, do not dispose of cooking fats, oils, and grease down the drain, and minimize the use of your garbage disposal. Garbage disposals don't keep grease out of the sewer system. When grease washes down the sink, it can build up in pipes and eventually cause a pipe blockage in your home or the Celebration sewer lines. Blocked pipes can cause raw sewage to back up into your home or overflow into streets and damage the environment. Kitchen waste can be disposed of in the following manner:

- Place food scraps in the trash
- Pour grease into an acceptable container, let it harden, then dispose of in the trash

Taking the easy steps above can prevent clogged drains and sewer backups!
